- **Performance from memory is mandatory in the Vocal Local-Provincial/National Class.**
- **Time limit** 30 minutes
- **For this year only**, because of Covid-19 concerns, **pre-recorded piano accompaniment is permitted.**
- A **selection** is defined as “a single movement composition or one or more movements of a multi-movement composition”. A group of songs by the same composer or from an existing song cycle by a composer is acceptable as a multimovement work.
- The inclusion of Canadian and Indigenous compositions is encouraged.
- Competitors must also comply with the general rules and regulations for the qualifying class.

Competitors must be recommended to Provincials from **THREE** advanced selections*. **For 2021, pre-recorded piano accompaniment is permitted.** Selections must be performed from memory. Please also read general regulations for the local qualifying classes.

1. **Time limit** 30 minutes
2. The inclusion of Canadian and Indigenous compositions is encouraged.
3. All selections are to be sung from a published score, in any published key of a staged musical.
4. Competitors may perform with costume enhancements (eg. hat, scarf, jacket, shawl) and one hand-held prop per selection.
5. Competitors may leave the stage briefly for a drink of water or to facilitate an entrance but must not leave the stage for complete costume changes.
6. Spoken passages are allowed only if published in the script/score provided.
7. The original copy can be the Broadway score, from an Anthology, or purchased online (proof of purchase must be provided).
8. Selections are **not** to include revues, operetta/light opera (eg. Romberg, Johann Strauss, Lehár, and Offenbach).
9. The Score submitted must match the version/revision being performed. The year of the revision is to be indicated on the entry form.

The recommended selections must include a Ballad* And Up-Tempo work*.

- The term “Ballad” is used to describe music with a slower tempo, often of a serious or introspective nature, eg. - “On My Own (from Les Misérables).
- The term “Up-Tempo” is used to describe music with a lively tempo. Often comedy, eg. - “One Hundred Easy Ways (from Wonderful Town).
